## The Light-Filled Month of January

January is one of the busiest liturgical months, full of important feasts and saints' days. We have already passed the Feast of the Circumcision and St Basil's Day (1 Jan), the Synaxis of the 70 Holy Apostles (4 Jan), then Theophany (6 Jan) paired with the feast of St John the Baptist (7 Jan). We are anticipating major holy days throughout the rest of the month in part because our calendar reflects that - from about the late fourth century — this period of the church year was set aside to honour theologians and teachers of the church. So we will celebrate also St Maximos the Confessor (21 Jan), St Gregory the Theologian (25 Jan), and St Ephraim the Syrian (28 Jan), and of course the month culminates in the Synaxis of the Three Holy Hierarchs (30 Jan): St Basil the Great, St Gregory the Theologian and St John Chrysostom.

January also marks a time of year when desert saints were inspired by or linked with the 40 days Christ spent in the desert immediately following His baptism. This month we celebrate examples such as St Syncletike (5 Jan), St Gregory of Nyssa (10 Jan), St Paul of Thebes (15 Jan), St Anthony the Great (17 Jan), St Makarius of Egypt (19 Jan), as well as St Euthymios the Great (20 Jan) who this month would retreat alone to the desert in explicit imitation of Christ.
