

Synaxis of the Archangel Gabriel, Kontakion

Supreme commander of God and minister of the Divine glory, guide of men and leader of the bodiless hosts: ask for what is to our profit and for great mercy, since thou art supreme commander of the bodiless hosts.


Feast of the Annunciation



As we celebrate this amazing feast of Christ's incarnation, the sacred arts of the church provide boundless ways to approach and contemplate its mysteries, so that we may again be moved by a familiar narrative. This year you might find inspiration in community member Sebastian Brock's recent online presentation for the Oxford Interfaith Forum, discussing an anonymous Syrian dialogue between the Virgin Mary and the Archangel Gabriel. His talk is suitable for a general audience and includes a reading of the full text, with its many invitations to enter into the event and the viewpoint of two participants in this holy event.

The celebrated 12th-century <u>icon of the Annunciation</u> to the left is another possible point of departure. Held at St Catherine's monastery Sinai, it is also symbolically rich and an unusual wonder of iconographical technique.

The day following an important feast often features a *synaxis* — a day specially honouring saintly participants in the salvation event just celebrated. Thus, the day after Annunciation is a synaxis of the Archangel Gabriel, God's messenger to the Theotokos who witnesses her acceptance of the crucial role she will play in the incarnation of Christ.
