I'm also on the Greek School board, help support our community volunteers, and pull together the weekly parish bulletin. We're a family of musicians — I trained as a violinist, my husband Alexander is a church musician and academic, and daughters Margaret & Ourania are both keen sopranos! —Ann Lingas

We are grateful to all the parishioners who recently have brought their membership up-to-date and established standing orders. The pandemic has of course had a large impact on in-person donations and caused our usual fundraising events to be cancelled, so if you are in a position to support the parish financially <u>donations via</u> <u>PayPal</u> or a standing order would be timely (<u>email for details</u>)! Please also consider <u>gift aid</u> which allows our community to claim additional funds on your donation.

In keeping with remembering the vulnerable during Advent, Fr Ian recently received a letter sent to all the North Oxford and Wolvercote churches by NOAAH (North Oxford Action Against Homelessness). He asks parishioners to consider sending them a <u>charitable donation</u> as part of our Advent preparations. Homelessness and aid dependency are likely to rise after the pandemic, so they are anticipating a greater demand on funds in the coming year, and are appealing to local churches for additional support. NOAAH has helped rough sleepers into accommodation and it has also assisted those who are struggling to remain in housing in a number of different ways — by making grants to help with unpaid bills, by supplying essential household items for people recently housed, and by paying for vans to move household goods. This organisation has no staff and no costs which means all the money raised goes directly to people in need.
