Benefit Concert

For twelve years, local pianist and educator Despina Nikolakis Mouchas has been organising family-friendly concerts yearly, in memory of her beloved daughter Artemis. This year's concert will feature her friend George Nikolaïdis, a Parisbased flautist who has been a welcome and engaging guest artist over the years. Mr Nikolaïdis will bring with him the talented pianist Jean-Pierre Dussert who only recently began performing in public again after many years without regular access to a piano. (The unusual story of their meeting and subsequent collaboration is the subject of a <u>prize-winning documentary</u> which will be available via private link to everyone who supports this year's benefit concert.) The duo will present a brilliant and varied programme of popular songs arranged for piano and flute including works by Bach, Mozart, Chopin, Bellini, Bizet and Rachmaninov.

Our popular reception with home-made Greek snacks will take place immediately afterwards!

Further information about the performers

The pair met through GRADISCA — an artists' collective founded by Mr Nikolaïdis — that takes part in music-making for hard-to-reach locations, such as hospitals and institutions for the elderly or people with disabilities. Mr Dussert's mother got in touch to describe his early studies as an unusually gifted young pianist who over time had had to curtail his musical activities when autism and schizophrenia took an increasing toll. He had nevertheless maintained his musical passion for years, playing on tables or in his head, while living in group accommodations without having access to a piano. GRADISCA worked to provide a piano at his residence as well as in a number of similar locations. Gradually a plan was undertaken so that Mr Dussert was able to perform and tour with Mr Nikolaïdis, once again showcasing his talent as a pianist.


