Memory Eternal!

On Saturday 11 October **Mary Cunningham Corran** passed away. Mary was born in the United States and though baptised Episcopalian was brought up as a Quaker, but in her studies at Harvard became more and more interested in the Byzantine Christian tradition. She moved to the UK to study at the University of Birmingham, where she gained her MA and PhD and during that period came to live in Oxford where she began to worship with our community at Canterbury Road. There she found an international and generous Orthodoxy, and after instruction from Bishop Kallistos she was received into the Orthodox Church in 1983. She went on to teach at Birmingham, Queen's University, Belfast and King's College, London before taking up a lectureship at the University of Nottingham, where she remained for the rest of her academic career.

Although forced to retire from teaching by illness in 2016, she continued to research and publish, and was happy to share her work via online lectures (see https://youtu.be/tc08FWIXQeA?si=gHBBZVgsPHScFwnR for an example from last year). Her particular area of interest was the Byzantine traditions concerning the Mother of God, and she has enriched us all with her translations, editions and original work. Closer to home she served regularly in the choir (singing was a particular love) and was for many years a member of the Parish Council of the Annunciation Parish and Secretary to the Joint Parish Councils.

Our condolences go to her husband, Richard, and to their children Emily and James. May her memory be eternal!


